Source: President Andrew Jackson's message to Congress on Indian removal, December 6, 1830.

What good man would prefer a country covered with forests and ranged (traveled) by a few thousand savages to our extensive Republic, studded with cities, towns, and prosperous farms embellished with all the improvements which art can devise or industry execute, occupied by more than 12,000,000 happy people, and filled with all the blessings of liberty, civilization and religion?

Note: The approximate population of the United States in 1830 was 12,000,000.
